The role will include liaison with Humber College as well as other colleges, the Ministry of Advanced Education and Skills Development and the Ontario College Retirees Association.


Our Association is organized for the benefit of its members and is funded by member fees. We endeavour to assist Humber College in its aims and objectives, especially as these relate to the support of students.

November 1999: Fourteen Humber Retirees representing faculty, support and administration met to discuss the possibility of forming a Humber Retirees' Association. A working group was formed.

January 2000: Bill Totten, President of St. Clair Retirees' Association made a presentation regarding the establishment of a viable retirees' organization. At this time there were only two active retirees' associations in the community college system - Mohawk College and St. Clair College.

June 2000: With the assistance of President Robert Gordon and his associate Doris Tallon, the Humber College Retiree's Association came into being.
